It is expected that a student who is developing skills and knowledge will need to demonstrate these securely across a wide range of studied areas in order to achieve at least good passes at GCSE.

Emerging – Demonstrating emerging skills and knowledge and beginning to apply these across studied areas. It is expected that a student who is demonstrating emerging skills and knowledge will need to demonstrate a developing ability to apply these across a wider range of studied areas in order to work towards achieving good passes at GCSE.
